Illinois Impact Initiative Charter School Program Sub-Grant:

Award Details:

- Awarded just under \$1,150,000 (pending final budget verification)
- Three-year grant structure
- Goal: Expand enrollment by at least 60 students in primary grades
- Addresses declining enrollment in lower grades

Year 1 - Planning Year (67% of funding - \$762,000):

Personnel Costs (\$162,000):

Full-time student recruitment specialist (planning year only)

- Portion of salaries for planning staff:
 - Director of Community Engagement
 - Principal
 - Instructional Guides (14% of salary allowable)

Equipment:

- Two 15-passenger vans with Polaris branding

State of Education - Critical Legal Concern:

Supreme Court Case - Religious Charter School:

- Case fast-tracked, arguments begin April 30th
- First Catholic charter school (online) in Oklahoma
- Initially approved, then blocked by state Supreme Court
- Issue: Whether charter schools are public schools
- If Supreme Court allows religious charter school, could rule charter schools are NOT public schools
- Decision expected late June/early July
- Potential impacts:
 - State funding mechanisms would need restructuring
 - CPS authorization status uncertain
 - Public building occupancy questions
 - Major charter organizations filing briefs against

Local Charter School Environment:

Chicago Public Schools Board:

- Tumultuous period for charter schools
- Charter renewals pushed back two months
- 11 schools given only 2-year renewals (will join next renewal cohort)
- Polaris only school in last 3 cohorts to receive full 5-year renewal
- Acero schools closing CPS taking 5 campuses, 2 closing entirely
- New board passed non-binding resolution addressing charter schools
- Increased scrutiny expected on finances
- Board member outreach planned through Illinois Network of Charter Schools
